
Honoring our Legion Dead at NJ Legion Statewide Services and Social

Locustwood Memorial Park , in the mid 1930's, donated graves/section to the NJ American Legion, for Legionnaires and their families, which is located by the Legion memorial and flagstaff.

The cemetery is the only official American Legion burial ground in New Jersey. Since that time, NJ American Legion Posts throughout the state hold a Memorial Service honoring all our Legion deceased on the Sunday after Memorial Day, along with a parade through the cemetery and a Social at our Post afterwards.

Passing of LTC AI Bancroft—A True Veterans Advocate



It is with heavy hearts we report the passing of our dear friend USMC veteran Ltc Alfred Bancroft, who was also a prior member of American Le- retired from the Camden gion Post 372.

Al was born an identical twin in New Haven, Connecticut on It gives some comfort that we August 31, 1939. On March 14, 1958 Alfred and Raymond enlisted in the USMC. The Colonel went on to complete three tours in Vietnam and was among the first Marines who landed in 1965. While in Viet Nam, he served in Da Nang, Chu Lai, and Hoi An. He also served near the beach, where he worked unloading weaponry from ships and volunteering for patrols. In 1967, he helped establish an orphanage for Vietnamese chil-

dren. On November 1, 1991 The Colonel retired from the USMC with 33 years of active service. Throughout his military career he was a highly decorated and accomplished Marine. He has received numerous awards and letters of appreciation for all that he has done.
