



It is with deep regret we announce the news that American Legion Post 372 Veteran, James T Maher, passed away on March 3rd, 2024. Jim was a

member of our Post for 37 years.

Jim served a tour in Korea and a tour in Vietnam, On Aug 26, 1969, Jim was honorably discharged from the United States Army. Heserved his country well and was proud to be an American.

Jim entered duty with FBI on October 19, 1970 and retired in 2001 as a Supervisory Special Agent and was inducted into the International Police Association Hall of Fame.

He was the past Chairman of Stand Down of South Jersey for 20+ years, volunteer/member on the Battleship NJ and several other organizations.

He, his FBI friends and Army Garrison buddies used to meet at the Legion once a month for a lunch social prior to COVID. He will be sorely missed and never forgotten.

Another hero, Army Cpt Greg Dalessio, who grew up in the Knollwood Section of Cherry Hill, is buried in Colestown Cemetery.

Cpt Dalessio was fatally shot on June 23, 2008 as he emerged from a weekly reconstruction meeting with Iraqi officials in the city of Salman Pak. The gunman in that attack also killed another American soldier and wounded three others. He was assigned to the 2nd Bat-

others. He was assigned to the 2nd Bat tallon, 6th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 1st Armored Division and was on his second tour.

Since his death in 2008, his family has held an Annual Cpt Greg Dalessio 5K Run/Walk on the 1st Saturday in Decem-



MEDAL OF HONOR RECIPIENT GEORGE R. CHOLISTER

George Robert Cholister was born in Camden NJ to Harold (Harry) and Hannah Albertha Glandon Cholister on December 18, 1898. He was the fourth of eight children. George was educated in Ellisburg School (Delaware Twp/Cherry Hill) His father was a police officer in the town of Stockton and then later the Superintendent of Colestown Cemetery (Delaware Twp/Cherry Hill) for over 30 years.

George enlisted in the Navy on April 11, 1916 and was in the eighth year of his enlistment when he sustained the injuries which resulted in his death.

During the World War, George served on a submarine in the North Sea and was later transferred to the US Destroyer Fanning, which was officially credited with sinking 3 German submarines.


